HOB Y Application

Procedure: The first step in the HOB Y selection process is to complete the questions below and return them to the high school counseling office.

Directions: Answer each question below in 75 words or less. Continue on the back if necessary.

1. How have you demonstrated leadership ability? (Leadership may be defined as the ability to motivate others into action. Examples include involvement in youth organizations, student government, school and/or community groups, participation in athletics or the arts, or effective communication with others.)

2. How have you expressed sensitivity and concern for others? How have you shown others that you are interested in their well-being? (Examples include a willingness to help others with their studies, to work on school/community projects, to assist with charitable fund-raisers, or take a first-aid course.)

3. How have you shown the desire to learn and share your knowledge and experience with others? (Examples include asking questions and/or volunteering answers, joining in discussions that are not required, and participating in group study, researching a topic and then sharing your knowledge with others.)
